# What if you lose your COVID-19 Vaccination Card?

To get a booster shot, you need your vaccination card — **what if you can't find it?** 

### If you were Vaccinated by:


- A doctor/PCP OR at a community health center
  - ⇒ Contact your doctor/PCP
- A local health department OR "pop-up" clinic
  - ⇒Contact your doctor/PCP
- Mass vaccination site (Fenway, Hynes Convention Center, Gillette Stadium, Reggie Lewis Center, Natick Mall, Eastfield Mall, etc.)
  - ⇒Contact your doctor/PCP OR
  - Follow instructions for your site at: <a href="https://www.mass.gov/info-details/requesting-a-copy-of-your-covid-19-vaccination-record">https://www.mass.gov/info-details/requesting-a-copy-of-your-covid-19-vaccination-record</a>
- CVS
  - ⇒Get a printed record of vaccination *or* digital proof (using a secure QR code you keep on your phone.)
  - ⇒Will <u>NOT</u> give replacement cards



<u>NOTE</u>: If you have an official "vaccination record", you can ask your doctor/PCP for another CDC card.



# Stop & Shop: Now Accepts EBT Card Payments for Pickup and Delivery

Have SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) benefits?






- Can be used for eligible food and grocery items
- Must have an alternative credit/debit card or checking account for any items <u>not</u> SNAP eligible
- SNAP does not cover additional fees, taxes, or driver tips

### Fees:

- Pickup orders: \$2.95 fee
- Delivery orders:
  - ♦ \$9.95 fee (orders less than \$100)

# **Important Notice: Do You Get SSI?**

Previously, Social Security Administration (SSA) counted pandemic-related financial assistance against SSI eligibility or benefit amount. Some people's SSI benefits were reduced/stopped; some SSI applications were denied.

Due to the seriousness of COVID-19, now SSA decided **NOT** to count *most* types of COVID-19 financial assistance.


Their Deaf mother and father met while she was living on Water Street. They got married and started a family in Worcester, where they raised their three Deaf daughters.
