COVID-19 Updates

Pfizer Vaccine for Children Who can get the Pfizer children's vaccine?

- Kids ages 5 11
- Who live or go to school in Massachusetts
- *Children's dose is *smaller than* an adult dose (ages 12 and up)

How do I make an appointment for my child?

- Contact your child's doctor, **OR**
- Search VaxFinder.mass.gov

Booster Shots

Why get a COVID-19 Booster?

- COVID-19 vaccines' protection lowers over time.
- **Booster shots** (Pfizer, Moderna or J&J) keep vaccines working longer.
- COVID-19 vaccines and boosters prevent severe illness, hospitalization, and death *even against the Delta variant*.

Booster shots are <u>FREE</u> — you don't need ID, health insurance or to pay.

How do I know when I got my last COVID-19 vaccine?

• Look at your CDC vaccination card for your shot date(s).

Can't find your vaccination card?

- Contact your primary care doctor, or the pharmacy (CVS, Walgreens, etc.) where you got your 1st vaccine, *OR*
- Get your vaccination record at: www.mass.gov/myvaxrecord

NOTE: THIS COULD TAKE *UP TO 2 WEEKS*.

Heating Help 101

LIHEAP - Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (Fuel Assistance)

A program run by local agencies in Massachusetts (under *Department of Housing and Community Development*, *DHCD*). It helps people with low-income pay winter heating bills (November 1 — April 30, every year).

- Got Fuel Assistance last year? Must fill-out the Recertification Application for help this year.

Who can get help? Eligibility is based on income:

- Last 4 weeks of gross income for your household (everyone you live with)
- **NOT** income: Stimulus funds; Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA)

Have a Phone with 3G Service?

3G Service will end in 2022. Older phones and devices will lose call and data functions — **including calling 9-1-1**!

- AT&T will stop 3G service in February 2022.
- T-Mobile Sprint stop 3G service on March 31, 2022.
- Verizon will stop 3G service by the end of 2022.

Are you a Consumer or PCA in the MassHealth PCA Program?

Your Fiscal Intermediary (FI) will be changing to Tempus Unlimited beginning on January 1, 2022.

If you do not already use Tempus Unlimited as your FI, here's what you need to do:

- 1. Check your mail and email, or go online
 - You should have already received a letter and/or email from Tempus Unlimited that includes pre-filled forms for you to complete.
 - Can't find a letter or forms? Contact Tempus at 877-479-7577 or MAFMS@tempusunlimited.org, or visit Tempus' website at https://tempusunlimited.org/ma-transition/ to download blank forms.
- 2. Fill out your forms and return them to Tempus FI
 - o Complete each required form
 - Send back to Tempus as soon as possible NO LATER than December 17, 2021



The holidays will be here soon! Remember to include deaf and hard of hearing children in social gatherings and conversations.

- Play deaf-friendly games (with visual cues
 — not oral).
- Turn on closed captions on the TV.
- Check-in and ask questions to make sure your child is following conversations.
- Minimize background noise.

Thanksgiving Safety



- Stovetop: stay in the kitchen and watch food you're cooking.
- Oven: stay home and check food often.
- Keep children at least 3 feet away from the stove/oven.
- Watch kids near hot foods and liquids:
 - ♦ Steam, oil, boiling water, gravy, coffee, etc. can cause *serious burns*.
- Tripping hazards: move toys, bags, etc. off the floor make a clear pathway.
- Keep knives out of reach!
- Move wires/cords out of children's reach: electric knife, coffee maker, plate warmer, mixer, etc.
- Keep matches locked up in high cabinets.
- Never leave children alone with a lit candle.
- Test your smoke alarms to be sure they work!
