COVID-19 Test to Treat

Faster, Easier Access to Life-Saving COVID-19 Treat

Locator

Test to Treat initiative

"One-Stop Test to Treat" sites — go to 1 place:


- 1) Get tested;
- 2) If you test positive for COVID-19,
- 3) Get **free** lifesaving COVID-19 treatment there, fast.
 (A doctor or nurse will give you a prescription that will be filled there.)

You can continue to be tested and treated by your own doctor or nurse. They will prescribe treatment as needed.

COVID-19 Vaccine Boosters

The CDC approved some people for a 2nd booster dose (*Pfizer-BioNTech* or *Moderna*).

You can get a 2nd booster dose if you:

- Got Johnson & Johnson/Janssen -2 times (1st and booster doses) 4 months or more ago
- Are 50 or older AND got any booster dose 4 months or more ago
- Are moderately or severely immunocompromised, 12 years or older, AND got any booster dose 4 months or more ago






Quarantine and Isolation Calculator


This new CDC tool tells you how long, people sick with COVID-19 and close contacts need to stay home, get tested, and wear a well-fitting mask.

- Best Actor in a Supporting Role





P-EBT Approved for School Year 2021-2022

Pandemic EBT (P-EBT) benefits for students who missed school **due to COVID-related absences**, will be given to school-age children and their families through school year 2021-2022. Benefit amounts depend on how many *COVID-related excused* absences a student has in a month.

- 1-5 absences: \$21 a month per student
- 6-15 absences: \$71 a month per student
- 16+ absences: \$128 a month per student



When will families get payments?

- May 25, 2022: Eligible families will get a payment for September 2021 April 2022
- May 25th AND June 25th (for May and June the last 2 months of the school year)

Where? On your P-EBT card (the same card as before).

Lost your P-EBT Card?

• Ask for another card at: https://dtaconnect.eohhs.mass.gov/pebt



Students newly eligible for *P-EBT* benefits will get payments:

• On their *EBT* card (if already getting DTA benefits) *or*

• A *P-EBT* card will be mailed to them (if they're <u>not yet</u> getting DTA benefits)




