

Mexican Dip Recipe (from DHILS Holiday Party)

Ingredients:



(1) - 8 oz package



(1) jar salsa



(1) 8 oz package shredded Mexican or Cheddar cheese

Directions:

- 1. Spread the cream cheese in a 8" or 9" pie plate.

- Became blind after a childhood accident.






January 13th: National Rubber Ducky Day
